About the Speakers

Jeffrey A. Kottler is one of the most prominent authors and presenters in the fields of counseling, psychotherapy, health, education, and advocacy. He has written over 100 books about a wide range of subjects, including *On Being a Therapist*, *Creative Breakthroughs in Therapy*, *Bad Therapy*, *The Client Who Changed Me*, *Stories We've Heard*, *Stories We've Told: Life-Changing Narratives in Therapy and Everyday Life*, *Relationships in Counseling and the Counselor's Life*, *On Being a Master Therapist*, *Secrets of Exceptional Counselors*, *Living and Being a Therapist: Selected Writings of Jeffrey Kottler*, and *Handbook of Refugee Experience*. His books have been translated into dozens of languages.

Jeffrey has been a counselor, therapist, supervisor, and educator for 45 years, having worked at a preschool, middle school, mental health center, crisis center, hospital, medical school, refugee resettlement agency, nongovernmental organization (NGO), university, community college, private practice, and disaster relief settings. He is also the founder of Empower Nepali Girls, a foundation that supports and mentors at-risk children. He has served as a Fulbright scholar and senior lecturer in Peru and Iceland, as well as worked as a visiting professor in New Zealand, Australia, Hong Kong, Singapore, and Nepal. Jeffrey is Professor Emeritus at California State University, Fullerton and Resident Scholar at the Alliance for Multicultural Community Services in Houston, Texas.

Charles Bell is the Deputy Director of Shoreline Behavioral Health Services. He has worked at Shoreline Behavioral Health Services for approximately 19 years, serving as Treatment Director for approximately 10 years, Assistant Director of Treatment Services, and Outpatient Clinical Addiction Counselor. Initially, he hired as the Coordinator of the Social Detox and residential Care Facility. Prior to Shoreline he served in the United States Navy and worked as the Patient Administration Department Head of the Addiction Rehabilitation Department of Portsmouth Naval Hospital in Norfolk, Virginia. Charles serves on the APSC Board of Directors.

James Campbell, LPC, LAC, MAC, AADC, has been working professionally in the human services field for over twenty-five years. His passion is helping individuals, families, and relationships to heal through leveraging their strengths and supporting other helping professionals as they cultivate their skills and expertise to assist others more effectively. He is also a member of both NAADAC and ACA. James is the immediate past President of APSC and has worked in a wide range of clinical settings over the years. Currently, he serves as the Training and Technical Assistance Manager for the Southeast Addiction Technology Transfer Center located at the National Center for Primary Care at Morehouse School of Medicine and works privately as a nationally recognized author, consultant, professor, and speaker.

Nicole S. Deems, S., LMFT, LAC CS, RYT received an undergraduate degree in psychology from the University of South Carolina where she returned for a graduate degree in Counselor Education, specializing in Marriage and Family Therapy. Nicole has worked with LRADAC, one of the leading substance use treatment centers in the Midlands of South Carolina, since 2006 and is currently the Director of Clinical Advancement where she provides clinical supervision, coaching and training for agency staff. Nicole's clinical experience has been in providing therapeutic treatment services to children, adolescents, adults, couples and families in areas related to mental health, substance use disorders, trauma, and family systems. Nicole operates a clinical private practice where she provides therapy, training and consultation, as well as clinical supervision to those seeking licensure as a LMFT or certification as an addictions counselor in the state of SC. Nicole has held positions on the board for the APSC since 2014 and serves as President for the Association in 2021-2022. Nicole is passionate about health and wellness and believes that healing occurs best with connection and intention. She has completed her 200-hour training as a Registered Yoga Teacher and is trained in trauma-informed yoga practices for the healing of trauma and recovery. Nicole sees her work as improving the lives of individuals and as well as building stronger, healthier communities.

Ed Johnson, LPC, LAC/S, MAC, CS, CPRS, has been at the Southeast Addiction Technology Transfer Center (Southeast ATTC) located at the National Center for Primary Care, Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta since 2010 and is currently the Associate Director for Training and Technical Assistance. He has over 25 years of experience providing direct services to individuals with Substance Use Disorders (SUD) and Co-Occurring Disorders.
